Reading - Ms. Corrigan's group will begin reading a version of 'Little House in the Big Woods'  while focusing on fluency, accuracy and comprehension. The children in my reading group will continue their novel study of 'Little House in the Big Woods,' exploring the target skill summarizing.

Language Arts - In phonics, we will practice the schwa sound /u/ (baby short u sound), spelled with **a, e, or o** in multi-syllabic words.

Religion - We continue reading our chapter titled, 'Going forth.'

Science - Continuing our study of animals, last week we participated in a lesson about biodiversity using the frogs  of North America. In the activity, 'Who's Calling?', students learned to identify frogs by their unique calls and to recognize frog sounds in different environments. This week we will review what we learned in this lesson and take a short quiz demonstrating our understanding.

Social Studies - Last week we continued to pay tribute to the generations of Asian Pacific Islanders who have enriched America's History, and we read the book, 'William Hoy,' about a deaf boy who made a difference in baseball.  This week we will listen to the book, 'The Fearless Flight of Hazel Ring Lee.'
